## What education is needed for vulnerable children in the world ?

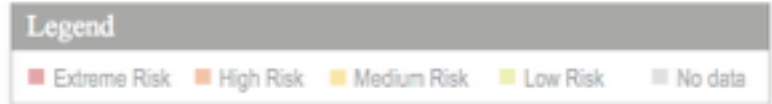
Help employers become aware of this problem

- Why do so many children in the world work ?**
- Poverty
